NOTICE OF HEARING AND PROCEDURAL ORDER

A hearing in this case will take place before the Alaska Public Offices Commission at approximately 2:00 p.m. on Thursday, January 16, 2025.

The Commissioners will be present in-person, by telephone, or via Microsoft Teams and will receive evidence regarding this matter. You may be present at the hearing either by telephone (1-907-202-7104, Access Code: 542 592 595#), in-person (2221 E. Northern Lights Blvd, Ste 128, Anchorage, Alaska, 99508), or via [Microsoft Teams Meeting](#).¹ You may be, but are not required to be, represented by an attorney or agent.

If you wish to participate by telephone and are an individual who requires a special accommodation to participate, you must advise the Commission office on or before January 6, 2025, so that a special accommodation can be made.

PREHEARING AND HEARING PROCEDURES

- 1) **Parties.** The parties in this case are Commission Staff and Respondent.
- 2) **Issues.** At the hearing, the Commission will consider whether the Respondents failed to disclose expenditures related to print and media communications disseminated during his 2024 campaign and failed to provide complete contributor information on his 30 Day General campaign disclosure report.
- 3) **Procedural history.** Caroline Storm filed a complaint against Craig Johnson on October 21, 2024. The Respondent did not file an answer to the complaint. Staff’s investigation report recommending the complaint be upheld was issued on December 31, 2024.

- 4) **Hearing procedures.** The hearing will be conducted as provided in AS 15.13.380, 2 AAC 50.891, and the Alaska Administrative Procedure Act, AS 44.62.330 – 44.62.630. All testimony must be presented or submitted under oath. A party may call witnesses, cross-examine witnesses, present and rebut evidence. If the respondent does not testify, the respondent may be called and examined as if under cross-examination.
- 5) **Evidence and exhibits.** All relevant evidence may be admissible at the hearing. In passing upon the admissibility of evidence, the Commission may consider, but is not bound to follow, the rules of evidence governing general civil proceedings in the courts of the State of Alaska. The Commission may exclude inadmissible evidence and order repetitive evidence discontinued.
- 6) **Prehearing filings.** No later than January 6, 2025, a party:
 - a) may file a list of witnesses expected to testify at the hearing;
 - b) may file copies of exhibits to be presented at the hearing that are marked and identified (for example, Resp.'s Ex. A);
 - c) may file a prehearing memorandum;
 - d) may file prehearing motions, including motions to dismiss, for summary judgment, or to exclude evidence, and
 - e) shall serve all parties and the Complainant with filings submitted.
- 7) **Response to motions and requests for subpoenas.** No later than January 13, 2025, a party
 - a) may respond to a motion; and
 - b) may request the Commission to issue subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses, the production of documents, or other things related to the subject of the hearing, and is responsible for serving the subpoena and paying the appropriate witness fee.
- 8) **Extensions of time.** Requests to extend the deadlines in this order must be in writing, filed with the Commission, served on all parties and the Complainant, and supported by good cause.
- 9) **Burden of proof.** The Commission staff has the burden to prove any charges by a preponderance of the evidence.

10) Order of proceedings. Matters considered at a hearing will ordinarily be disposed of in substantially the following order:

- a) pending motions, if any;
- b) complainant may present argument under 2 AAC 50.891(d)
- c) presentation of cases as follows, unless otherwise ordered by the Commission:
 - i) The Commission Staff's direct case, including the investigative report, evidence, and testimony of witnesses;
 - ii) Respondent's direct case;
 - iii) Rebuttal by the Commission Staff; and
 - iv) Closing statements, if any, by Respondent and Commission Staff.

10) Decision and Order. The Commission will issue an order no later than 10 days after the close of the record.

SUMMARY OF COMPLAINT

The Complainant alleges that the Respondent failed to disclose expenditures related to both print and media communications disseminated during the Respondents 2024 State House campaign; the Complainant further alleges that the occupations and employer information of five contributors have been omitted from the Respondent's 30 Day General campaign disclosure report.¹

SUMMARY OF ANSWERS TO COMPLAINT

No answer was received from the Respondent.

FACTS

Mr. Johnson was campaigned for re-election to the State House in the 2024 state election. In his 30 Day General Campaign Disclosure Report, filed on October 7, 2024, he disclosed contributions from five individuals (Steve Strait, Heath Hilyard, Lolly Reid, Dan Saddler and Rhonda Scott) without detail information regarding occupation or employer.²

On or about September 25, 2024, the candidate mailed fliers advocating his candidacy³ and disseminated online communications regarding his opponent.⁴ An examination of Mr. Johnson's 30 Day General Campaign Disclosure Report did not

disclose any of the usual expenditures related to these communications, such as printing, postage or online content providers or services.

LAW AND ANALYSIS

Campaign disclosure statutes mandate that contributions made by an individual must be reported; for all such contributors, the reported information must include the amount and date of the contribution, in addition to the name and address of the contributor. For contributions in excess of \$50 in the aggregate during a calendar year, the principal occupation and the employer of the contributor are also required.⁵ Here, a cash contribution from Dan Saddler in the amount of \$50 was disclosed on the Respondent’s 30 Day General Report; a prior contribution in the amount of \$96.06 from Mr. Saddler was reported as received on July 8, 2024, and was disclosed on the Respondent’s 7 Day Primary Report on August 13, 2024.⁶ As the contributions from Dan Saddler exceeded \$50 in aggregate during the calendar year, information regarding his occupation and employer was required to be disclosed. The reported contributions of the other four individuals referenced in the complaint were all in amounts of \$50 or less; a review of the Respondent’s prior calendar year reports did not disclose any additional contributions by any of the other four named individuals.

Candidates are required to accurately and timely report campaign expenditures.⁷ Expenditures are defined as “...a purchase or a transfer of money or anything of value, or promise or agreement to purchase or transfer money or anything of value, incurred or made for the purpose of...influencing the nomination or election of a candidate...” and includes “an express communication or an electioneering communication...”⁸ Upon reviewing campaign expense records provided by the Respondent in response to a staff request, it was noted that invoiced amounts of \$5,700 were billed to the campaign by the Ritacco Group

LLC for mailers and \$207.36 for Facebook advertising on August 30, 2024.⁹ Similarly, the campaign was also invoiced for \$4,775.05 in mailer costs and \$6,236.44 in charges related to various electronic media communications on October 7, 2024.¹⁰ Although the specific dates the expenses were incurred is not specified, the invoiced dates clearly indicate these expenditures, or agreements to such obligations, were incurred during the 30 day general reporting period (August 11 to October 4, 2024) and should have been disclosed on the 30 Day General Campaign Disclosure Report. This report, however, discloses expenditures in the amount of only \$498.60, the majority of which are identified as bank or electronic fees; and the report discloses no outstanding debts.¹¹

CONCLUSION

The Respondent failed to disclose the occupation and employer of Dan Saddler on his 30 Day General Campaign Disclosure Report, who had contributed amounts in excess of \$50 during the calendar year; this omission constitutes a violation of AS 15.13.040 (a)(1)(D). Because the other four contributors identified in the complaint contributed less than \$50 in the aggregate during calendar year 2024 Respondent was not required to disclose their occupation and employer information.

The Respondent failed to timely disclose expenditures made in regard to express communications in the form of mailed fliers and internet postings related to his candidacy in violation of AS 15.13.040 and AS 15.13.110.

MAXIMUM CIVIL PENALTIES

The maximum civil penalty for reporting violations for a 30 day report is \$50 per day for each day the violation continues.¹² For purposes of calculating the maximum civil penalties, the accrual of penalties began the day after the report was due (October 8, 2024)

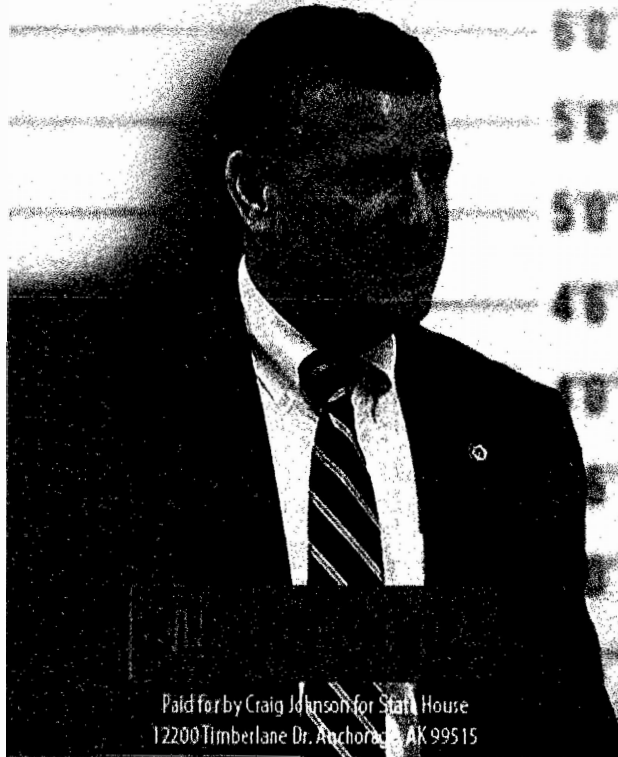
