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Meeting

Chair Hickerson called the meeting to order.

Advisory Opinion Request, 11-05-LOB

Ms. Ware presented staff's recommendation regarding the advisory opinion request by Jim Jansen, President of Lynden, Rick Boyles, President of the Teamsters, and Randy Johnson of AK Ship & Drydock.
