LETTER OF INTENT

Who should file a Letter of Intent?

If you intend to run for state or municipal office and you wish to begin your campaign, you should first file this Letter of Intent with the Commission.

Why?

The Letter of Intent permits you to make campaign expenditures prior to declaring with the Division of Elections or filing for office with your municipal clerk. AS 15.13.100 & 2 AAC 50.274.

Also, if it is less than 18 months before the election, this Letter permits you to accept campaign contributions. *Please note: incumbent candidates for state office should check with the Legislative Ethics Committee for additional restrictions on fundraising during the legislative session.*

Finally, the letter provides us with a way to contact you to let you know about upcoming trainings, new educational materials and report deadlines.

I INTEND TO BE A CANDIDATE IN THE _____ ELECTION.

Although I have not yet satisfied the filing requirements as a candidate, I will comply with the requirements of AS 15.13 as though I were already a candidate.

PLEASE NOTE: To reimburse yourself after the election for a personal contribution/loan to the campaign, you must notify the Commission within five (5) days of the date of the contribution/loan. (AS 15.13.078(b)(2)).

The reimbursement may not occur until after the date of the election, in accordance with AS 15.13.116. **In addition, a candidate may not give or loan more than \$5,000 to their own campaign during the 33 days prior to the election.**
