This form can be used to obtain an exemption for a church or religious organization. To obtain an exemption for the following reasons, this form is not required. You would need to submit the specified document along with the other required documents shown below in order to obtain one of these exemptions:

- **Charitable or Non-Profit Organizations** must provide a letter from the IRS that verifies the organization's tax exempt status.
- **Alaska Native Tribal Village Councils** must provide an affidavit stating that the vehicle is used only to conduct Village business. This can be written in either the affidavit or comment section of the application. (Form 812 or 821)

Items required:

- Vehicle Transaction Application (821) or an Application for Title and Registration (812).
- ORIGINAL requests cannot be processed over the Internet. Renewals can be processed using this service.

Additional Information:

- You may transfer plates to another vehicle by completing form 821 and paying a \$5.00 transfer fee.
- You may register more than one exempt vehicle.
