Investment Objective

To provide the balanced accomplishment of long-term growth of capital, current income and conservation of principal through investments in stocks and fixed-income securities.

How The Fund Works

The Fund is actively managed and invests in a diversified mix of stocks and bonds: stocks of large and small companies based in the US and abroad; corporate bonds of US and international companies and government bonds issued by the US and other governments.²

Investor Profile

The Fund is appropriate for those investors with mid- to long-term investment horizons who wish to take advantage of opportunities around the world while relying on professional portfolio managers to determine the appropriate investment mix.

Fund Benchmark

Because the Fund invests in many types of securities, a meaningful comparison is a combination of the unmanaged indices listed here: 35% S&P 500[®] Composite Index; 10% Russell 2000[®] Index; 15% EAFE (Europe, Australasia and Far East) Index Net Dividends to US Investors; 35% Salomon Bros. Broad Investment-Grade Bond Index and 5% Salomon Bros. Non-US Dollar World Bond Index.

Fund Management

The Fund is managed by portfolio managers at Capital Guardian Trust Company (CGTC). These managers gradually adjust the asset allocation of the Fund's holdings in an effort to increase return and minimize risk. In other words, the Fund offers you built-in diversification and professional, experienced portfolio managers who determine the asset mix.

The Fund allows investors the opportunity

to take advantage of a wide range of investments. Many of those opportunities are overseas. In fact, more than half of the world's stocks and roughly half of the world's bonds are now issued outside the US, according to the Morgan Stanley Capital International Perspective.

Why invest in stocks and bonds from around the world? The reason is diversification. Bond and stock markets tend to move in different cycles both in the US and abroad. By combining a global mix of stocks and bonds, you may, over time, experience profitable periods in any asset class. In addition, by not putting all your eggs in one basket, you may protect yourself from down cycles in any one type of security or region.


