Investment Objective

To provide income and capital appreciation by diversified investment in the U.S. equity market and to replicate the total return of the Standard & Poor's 500® Composite Stock Price Index (S&P 500® Index).²

How The Fund Works

The Fund is a passively managed fund that buys and holds all of the equity securities in the S&P 500® Index. It owns all 500 of the securities in the Index in proportion to each security's size as measured by its total market value. No attempt is made by the Fund managers to select securities which will outperform the market. However, Standard & Poor's does analyze securities for credit worthiness prior to adding them to the Index. The S&P 500® Index is maintained at exactly 500 securities with additions and deletions occurring due to spinoffs, mergers, acquisitions, illiquidity and bankruptcy.

Investor Profile

The Fund is for investors with average to above average risk tolerance. Although the equity market does experience fluctuations, it has historically provided higher returns than fixed-income vehicles. This is important for those with a long time horizon who wish to maximize long-term growth.

Fund Benchmark

The S&P 500® Index, compiled by Standard & Poor's, is designed to have the same industry representation as the U.S. Gross National Product. State Street calculates that the 500 securities represent approximately 75% of the total market value of all U.S. stocks.

Fund Management

State Street Global Advisors manages the Fund. State Street Bank and Trust Company, a wholly-owned subsidiary of State Street Boston Corporation, is one of the nation's largest managers of institutional assets with over \$1,900 billion

in assets under management. State Street Global Advisors (SSGa), the institutional investment management area of State Street, was established in 1978.
