Dear Ms. Johnson,

This is in reply to the questions posed by your e-mail:

1. Permission to enter private property for purposes of drilling must be worked out between the company proposing to drill and the owner of the private property. If the State of Alaska owns the mineral rights under the property and has leased them to a company, then the surface owner can contact the Alaska Department of Natural Resources if assistance is needed to resolve issues between the surface owner and a lessee of the mineral estate.
2. Public input and participation is always invited as part of the process of adopting new regulations. As I believe you know, a public hearing on the proposed new Hydraulic Fracturing Regulations is scheduled to begin at 9:00 AM on Thursday, April 4, 2013 at the AOGCC offices at 333 West 7th Avenue, Anchorage, Alaska. Members of the public may attend the hearing and testify in person or may submit written comments. Members of the public may also arrange to provide testimony by telephone.
