Dear Mr. Walters:

By letter dated November 18, 2014, ConocoPhillips Alaska, Inc. (CPAI) requested cancellation of administrative approval (AA) Area Injection Order 2B.079.

In accordance with Rule 11 of Area Injection Order (AIO) 02C.000, the Alaska Oil and Gas Conservation Commission (AOGCC) hereby **GRANTS** CPAI's request to cancel the AA.

KRU 2T-32 developed a subsidence related surface casing leak in 2013. However, the Commission determined that water injection could safely continue if CPAI complied with the restrictive conditions set out in AA AIO 2B.079.

CPAI has performed a P&A of 2T-32 and a coil tubing sidetrack creating well 2T-32A (PTD 2140470). The surface casing leak is still present in the new well. A passing AOGCC witnessed Mechanical Integrity Test of the Inner Annulus (MITIA) of 2T-32A was achieved on November 9, 2014. AA AIO 2B.079 is no longer necessary to the operation of 2T-32 and is hereby CANCELLED. Injection into KRU 2T-32A will be governed by provisions of Administrative Approval AIO No. 2C.007 which will be issued separately. AIO 2C.000 superseded AIO 2B on June 19, 2014.

**RECONSIDERATION AND APPEAL NOTICE**

As provided in AS 31.05.080(a), within 20 days after written notice of the entry of this order or decision, or such further time as the AOGCC grants for good cause shown, a person affected by it may file with the AOGCC an application for reconsideration of the matter determined by it. If the notice was mailed, then the period of time shall be 23 days. An application for reconsideration must set out the respect in which the order or decision is believed to be erroneous.

The AOGCC shall grant or refuse the application for reconsideration in whole or in part within 10 days after it is filed. Failure to act on it within 10-days is a denial of reconsideration. If the AOGCC denies reconsideration, upon denial, this order or decision and the denial of reconsideration are **FINAL** and may be appealed to superior court. The appeal **MUST** be filed within 33 days after the date on which the AOGCC mails, **OR 30** days if the AOGCC otherwise distributes, the order or decision denying reconsideration, **UNLESS** the denial is by inaction, in which case the appeal **MUST** be filed within 40 days after the date on which the application for reconsideration was filed.

If the AOGCC grants an application for reconsideration, this order or decision does not become final. Rather, the order or decision on reconsideration will be the **FINAL** order or decision of the AOGCC, and it may be appealed to superior court. That appeal **MUST** be filed within 33 days after the date on which the AOGCC mails, **OR 30** days if the AOGCC otherwise distributes, the order or decision on reconsideration.

In computing a period of time above, the date of the event or default after which the designated period begins to run is not included in the period; the last day of the period is included, unless it falls on a weekend or state holiday, in which event the period runs until 5:00 p.m. on the next day that does not fall on a weekend or state holiday.
