
By letter dated October 27, 2014, ConocoPhillips Alaska, Inc. (CPAI) requested approval to amend Rule 4 of Administrative Approval AIO 21A.002 to extend the expiration date by an additional 12 months.

In accordance with Rule 10 of Area Injection Order (AIO) 21A.000, the Alaska Oil and Gas Conservation Commission (AOGCC) hereby **GRANTS** CPAI's request for an extension of the expiry date. However because AIO 21A expires on May 16, 2015, this approval is only valid until May 16, 2015. Administrative approvals are only valid while the Area Injection Order is in effect.


Condition 4 of AIO 21A.002 is amended as follows:

4. This approval shall expire on November 1, 2015 or upon the expiration of AIO 21A.000, whichever occurs first.

RECONSIDERATION AND APPEAL NOTICE

As provided in AS 31.05.080(a), within **20** days after written notice of the entry of this order or decision, or such further time as the AOGCC grants for good cause shown, a person affected by it may file with the AOGCC an application for reconsideration of the matter determined by it. If the notice was mailed, then the period of time shall be **23** days. An application for reconsideration must set out the respect in which the order or decision is believed to be erroneous.

The AOGCC shall grant or refuse the application for reconsideration in whole or in part within 10 days after it is filed. Failure to act on it within 10-days is a denial of reconsideration. If the AOGCC denies reconsideration, upon denial, this order or decision and the denial of reconsideration are **FINAL** and may be appealed to superior court. The appeal **MUST** be filed within **33** days after the date on which the AOGCC mails, **OR 30** days if the AOGCC otherwise distributes, the order or decision denying reconsideration, **UNLESS** the denial is by inaction, in which case the appeal **MUST** be filed within **40** days after the date on which the application for reconsideration was filed.

If the AOGCC grants an application for reconsideration, this order or decision does not become final. Rather, the order or decision on reconsideration will be the **FINAL** order or decision of the AOGCC, and it may be appealed to superior court. That appeal **MUST** be filed within **33** days after the date on which the AOGCC mails, **OR 30** days if the AOGCC otherwise distributes, the order or decision on reconsideration.

In computing a period of time above, the date of the event or default after which the designated period begins to run is not included in the period; the last day of the period is included, unless it falls on a weekend or state holiday, in which event the period runs until 5:00 p.m. on the next day that does not fall on a weekend or state holiday.
