By letter dated October 19, 2014, ConocoPhillips Alaska, Inc. (CPAI) requested cancellation of administrative approval (AA) Area Injection Order 2B.025.


In accordance with Rule 11 of Area Injection Order (AIO) 02C.000, the Alaska Oil and Gas Conservation Commission (AOGCC) hereby **GRANTS** CPAI's request to cancel the AA.

KRU 3N-08A developed a tubing by inner annulus pressure communication in 2007. However, the Commission determined that water injection could safely continue if CPAI complied with the restrictive conditions set out in AA AIO 2B.025.

CPAI has performed a P&A of 3N-08A and a coil tubing sidetrack creating 3N-08B. A passing AOGCC witnessed Mechanical Integrity Test of the Inner Annulus (MITIA) of 3N-08B was achieved on October 18, 2014. AA AIO 2B.025 is no longer necessary to the operation of 3N-08A or 3N-08B and is hereby **CANCELLED**. Injection into KRU 3N-08B will be governed by provisions of AIO No. 2C.000 which superseded AIO 2B on June 19, 2014.

**RECONSIDERATION AND APPEAL NOTICE**

As provided in AS 31.05.080(a), within **20** days after written notice of the entry of this order or decision, or such further time as the AOGCC grants for good cause shown, a person affected by it may file with the AOGCC an application for reconsideration of the matter determined by it. If the notice was mailed, then the period of time shall be **23** days. An application for reconsideration must set out the respect in which the order or decision is believed to be erroneous.

The AOGCC shall grant or refuse the application for reconsideration in whole or in part within 10 days after it is filed. Failure to act on it within 10-days is a denial of reconsideration. If the AOGCC denies reconsideration, upon denial, this order or decision and the denial of reconsideration are **FINAL** and may be appealed to superior court. The appeal **MUST** be filed within **33** days after the date on which the AOGCC mails, **OR 30** days if the AOGCC otherwise distributes, the order or decision denying reconsideration, **UNLESS** the denial is by inaction, in which case the appeal **MUST** be filed within **40** days after the date on which the application for reconsideration was filed.

If the AOGCC grants an application for reconsideration, this order or decision does not become final. Rather, the order or decision on reconsideration will be the **FINAL** order or decision of the AOGCC, and it may be appealed to superior court. That appeal **MUST** be filed within **33** days after the date on which the AOGCC mails, **OR 30** days if the AOGCC otherwise distributes, the order or decision on reconsideration.

In computing a period of time above, the date of the event or default after which the designated period begins to run is not included in the period; the last day of the period is included, unless it falls on a weekend or state holiday, in which event the period runs until 5:00 p.m. on the next day that does not fall on a weekend or state holiday.
