IT APPEARING THAT:

1. By letter dated December 10, 1986, ARCO Alaska, Inc., on behalf of the working interest owners of the Lisburne Oil Pool, has requested an exception to Conservation Order No. 207, Rule 10(a) for Lisburne Well L1-1.
2. Notice of public hearing was published in the Anchorage Daily news on December 18, 1986.
3. No protests were filed with the Commission.

FINDINGS:

1. The wellbore of Lisburne Well L1-1 exhibits a severe dogleg between 9000' MD and 9500' MD.
2. Production tools have already been lost in the wellbore as a result of wireline work below the dogleg.
3. Further wireline work to satisfy the Rule 10(a) requirement for a static bottomhole pressure survey prior to production could result in loss of equipment which may possibly force premature abandonment of a producing oil well.
4. Pressure data is not necessary from the well L1-1 for determining average reservoir pressure. Pressures from surrounding wells will be sufficient to adequately monitor Lisburne Oil Pool pressure in the area.

CONCLUSION:

Non-compliance with Rule 10(a) for well L1-1 will not jeopardize ultimate Lisburne Pool Recovery nor create waste.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED THAT the bottomhole pressure survey requirement of Conservation Order No. 207, Rule 10(a), is hereby waived for Lisburne Well L1-1.
